### Last Call for Applications!

This is a reminder that the Work Opportunities application deadline is Wednesday, June 18th! The Washington Access Fund has teamed up with Seattle-King County and Snohomish County Workforce



Development Councils to offer a new program with grant money and employment counseling for people with disabilities.

We will match every \$1 saved up to \$2,000. Save a dollar—get a dollar! If you save the maximum \$2,000 - that would mean you'd have \$4,000 to go towards your purchase goal.

This IDA program is funded through a Department of Labor Disability Employment Initiative grant. The sooner individuals sign up, the longer they have to save! Participants in the Work Opportunities IDA Program will be required to save for at least 3 months and a minimum of \$10 per month.
